Next Week's Gospel Reading Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (19th August 2018)

Gospel – John 6:51-58

I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Lighting in the Church- Now that we have completed upgrading our lights to LED, the electricity consumption will only be 40% we are therefore, saving 60% of what we used in the past. The present lights are 100 watts compared to 250 watts of sodium lights. It was originally installed in 1993. Thank you to Mike Borg and Tom Hargadon for getting the quotes and overseeing the work. The total expense for the new LED is £5,625 and new fuse board is £1230.
