#### Third Sunday of Easter

(15<sup>th</sup> April 2018)

#### Gospel – Luke 24:35-48

Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread. While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence. Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.

**Feast Divine Mercy** – this Sunday (8<sup>th</sup>) at 2:45p.m Divine Mercy Service led by Fr. Tom The service will include Chaplet, Reflection, Veneration of Divine Mercy Image, Benediction and Confessions, followed by light refreshments in the Coach House afterwards.

**Children's Liturgy** – There will be no Children's Liturgy this Sunday. Resumes on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> April.

**Restoration Funds** - total raised to date £92,300

**Information** - There are plans to change the Church lighting to LED as the present lights do not last very long and is quite expensive to keep bringing the electrician in to keep changing them. I am working with Tom Hargadon to get three company quotes and present them to the Finance Committee for approval.

**Sound System** - There have been a lot of suggestions regarding our sound system in the church, since it is not audible a lot of the time. I have called on the sound engineer numerous of times, to which he has always been very responsive. I have now asked him to look at updating the system in making it more audible. At the moment I am not sure of any costs involved. I will update you after his visit.

**Stations of the Cross by the North Porch** - cost of repair £1390+ VAT, Travel £180+VAT, two nights accommodation.

**Hibbert's Chapel Ceiling Repair:** £2800 + VAT, Travel cost £180+VAT, accommodation for two people over three nights, plus scaffolding hire costs.
