Message from Fr Shinto...

Dear Friends, The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ gives us an occasion to learn more about the importance and value of his "Real Presence," so that we may appreciate the Sacrament better and receive maximum benefit from receiving Jesus in Holy Communion. Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist both as a sacramental banquet and a sacrificial offering. The Eucharist is a visible sign that gives us God's grace and God's life and as a meal it nourishes our souls. The Eucharistic celebration is a re-presentation of Jesus' sacrifice on Calvary, completed in His Resurrection. We offer Jesus' sacrifice to God the Father for the remission of our sins, using signs and symbols. We were not able to receive the Holy Eucharist in the past few months but, instead of keeping us away from him, it should deepen in us our love for the Eucharist. And we need to take this as an opportunity to earnestly ask the Lord to bring us all back under the same roof, because as St. Paul reminds us in the second reading, "we all share from the same loaf". **Fr. Next Week's Gospel Reading Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 10:26-33

“So do not be afraid of them, for there is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known. What I tell you in the dark, speak in the daylight; what is whispered in your ear, proclaim from the roofs. Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. 
Those in Need Due to Covid
