SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Message from Fr Shinto...

Dear Friends,

The season of Easter is nearly at an end. This past Thursday we celebrated the Ascension of our Lord. The central theme of today's readings is a challenge to us to rejoice in our suffering for the Faith because the more we suffer the more we are identified with Jesus who has liberated us from the bondage of sin by his suffering and death. The Gospel gives us the beginning of the "High Priestly Prayer" in which Jesus prays for himself and for protection and unity for his disciples. In the first part of the section we hear today, Jesus prays for himself and his chosen apostles. He prays for the protection and unity of his disciples. In the second part, Jesus commends his apostles to the Father and prays for them because they have accepted the word of God and acknowledged his Divine origin as the Messiah. They have put their trust in Jesus and His Father. Jesus prays that they may act as agents of truth and love in the world, that they may be protected from evil, and that they may be one.

Make us strong in faith, persevering in service, constant in prayer.
